

BEST PRACTICE – I <u>READ A BOOK, WRITE A PARAGRAPH, GET A PEN</u> – "THE MORE YOU READ THE BEST YOU WRITE"

Goal:

Encouraging students about the prominence of reading. Knowing how to read, what to read, how much to read and when to read matters a lot. To inculcate the habit of reading and to make the students skillful in it we have started with the practice called **Read a Book**, **Write a Paragraph and Get a Pen**. In this activity students are free to take any book of their interest from the library, once they read it thoroughly they will be asked to write a creative paragraph and the best written paragraph will be awarded with a pen. The clear goal of this activity is to generate interest of reading books among the students utilizing our rich library resources.

The Context:

As the practice (Read a Book, Write a Paragraph and Get a Pen) and its introduction costs nothing there was any difficulty found in introducing it. Even students accepted the practice without any issue.



The Practice:

Reading is the powerful source of knowledge and information. Being students they have to have the habit of reading more and more books it's the only source to gain unlimited knowledge. It has been observed that today's generation is not studious yet they are having high IQ but reading supplements their knowledge.

Evidence of Success:
